
















Fridays in the Valley

Clearwater Forest Women's Chrysalis Retreat 2023

In 1984, 39 years ago, Clearwater Chrysalis was first called Clearwater Forest's Women's Health and Fitness Camp. Women exercised the entire weekend and ate only super healthy food. Thus, the Sunday tradition of stopping at Dairy Queen on the way home began!

Camp, like a chrysalis, has metamorphosed over time. Winter Chrysalis is a cozy time to relax and enjoy Minnesota's wonder and beauty. February camp is a two night event that invites women to slow down, enjoy conversation and try a few new things.



While there is still exercise at camp, it is balanced with other activities. The weekend program is designed to address body, mind, and spirit. There is a saying at camp – "Do as much or as little as you wish". This winter, in addition to our speaker, Reverend Chris Bellefeulle, drop in crafts, yoga and a special Saturday night entertainment, six workshops will be offered – Book Discussion, Walk into Nature, Cookie Flooding, Women of the Bible, Mixed Art Project, and Gardening with Native Plants. Immigrant Task Force Update



The Karwans, our sponsored family from Afghanistan, continue to make progress in their goals of assimilation into American culture. Silab hopes to take his drivers license test this winter, and we continue to ask for volunteers who will ride along with him as he practices driving.

Mina cares for her children and anticipates the birth of her third child this winter. Like so many families, they have experienced medical challenges, with trips to the clinic because of common illnesses. They are now connected with a medical social worker to help them learn to navigate medical concerns.

The Karwans are very grateful for everything that our Valley community has done for them. Silab expressed his gratitude recently, after he was able to select toys for his children at the PRISM holiday shop.

Silab is eager to move forward in his application for asylum, and he has long-term goals of US citizenship. He pays close attention to the news about legislation that will support the concerns of refugees and asylumseekers. He mentions frequently that he is disappointed that Congress keeps "canceling" the Afghan Adjustment Act because they don't think it's important. He needs reassurance that, because they have legal documents and an attorney tracking their case, they are safe for now and will not be deported.

Several of our team members have signed petitions and sent letters to the president and to legislators. But more needs to be done because many lawmakers mistakenly believe that people like Silab and his father who risked their security and were promised by the US military that they would be protected pose a risk to the US! Silab has State Department documents verifying his status, and it is time for lawmakers to hear from more of us.
