STEWARDSHIP 2023 UPDATE

Once again, Valley members have answered the call and pledged **\$423,900** to the church in 2023. That is **100%** of the goal set by the Stewardship Team. We are grateful for the **130** renewed pledges and the 10 new pledges!



The Breathing Life campaign wrapped up in 2022, with members donating more than \$98,000 to support our **new HVAC system**, along with half of the funds being split evenly between our community partners: **PRISM**,

Beacon Interfaith Housing Collaborative, Clearwater Forest and Liberty's Northside Healing Space.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT TASK FORCE









On November 12, 2022 the Land Acknowledgement Task Force hosted a Narrator Brunch to celebrate and thank the narrators and community partners who made the Haha Wakpadan Oral History Project possible. Dr. Kasey Keeler gave a presentation summarizing the project and the information shared by the narrators. We then all had a chance to reflect on the experience and talk about next steps. It was a special day and meant so much to be able to meet the narrators and partners who trusted us enough to be a part of the project.

The project is now completed (YAY!) and the task force has received bound copies of all of the interview transcriptions. And now begins the work of figuring out what Valley should do next. Since the narrator brunch, Jen Biggs gave a presentation about the project to the Golden Valley Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion Commission and Crystal Boyd also gave a presentation at the Spirit of Hope United Methodist Church.

Indeed the work continues and we are excited to figure out where it will take our congregation next!


