

Immigrant Task Force Update

Our sponsored Afghan family, **Silab and Mina Karwan**, **welcomed their new baby boy, Aryanullah, on February 7, 2023**. Now the family is returning to their Early Childhood Family Education classes every Tuesday. Many thanks to Valley volunteers who assist Mina and her kids as they enjoy the **ECFE classes**, which are supported with Afghan interpreters. **These classes are specifically for Afghan mothers, with topics about American culture, such as our libraries or health systems**.

Silab anxiously awaits the results of his application for asylum, but it might take several months until the decision is known. In the meantime, he is working 46 hours a week at his two jobs, continuing with his goal for a driver's license, and finding time to work out at a gym nearby.



He has explained that physical fitness was an important part of his work in security to support the American forces in Afghanistan. After he was wounded in the attack on the security building, his fitness deteriorated so he wants to regain his physical health.

We continue to be amazed by the resilience of the Karwan family as they work hard to build a new life for themselves. **They will** celebrate Afghan New Year on March 21 and then will observe the Muslim sacred season of Ramadan from March 22 until April 21. We wish them a happy and healthful year ahead.




