Maybe you are like me. After worship, I come home and check on our YouTube channel to see and hear the service through the cameras of our wonderful stream team. This week, I was blown away to see our *Chancel Area* filled with so many groceries! It was abundance and love at work! PRISM sent a truck to pick it all up on Monday. At this point, we sent 2,375 pounds of food for our neighbors in need! Thanks, Valley, for all your generosity.

You also noticed how moved Shelia and I were last Sunday by the number of children who came forward—some carrying groceries, too! We thank God for each family who is working hard to re-introduce their children to the experience of in-person worship. Kids are very flexible little creatures and I also appreciate that they know how to worship from the cabin or from a sunny climate! No one brings energy to our chancel area like our children.

On April 2nd, we will gather for Palm Sunday. We will have palms to wave, and we will dedicate our fish banks to One Great Hour of Sharing. Next Sunday, the *Chancel* will be filled with Hosannas!

Then on April 6th, we gather for Maundy Thursday around the communion table to remember the Last Supper. With the help of our young people, the *Chancel* will be stripped of ornamentation, marking the emptiness that the crucifixion left on this world. The service begins at 7:30 pm to assure that we will be able to experience the darkness of the service, now that daylight savings time is upon us. EARTH CARE CORNER

Who can own the song of a spring bird? "The earth is the Lord's," Psalm 24:1. Our Indigenous neighbors remind us to care for, not "own," Mother Earth when they say, "The earth is my grandmother." Two Valley members just attended virtual presentations from the Presbyterian Just Creation conference at Columbia Seminary in Atlanta. When speakers dug deep into the subjects of climate justice and the environment, it was often hard to feel hopeful.

We are the "building custodians" of the earth and not doing a very good job. If God was the "building principal," would we be fired? Speakers encouraged us to keep at it, keep showing up, be comfortable being uncomfortable when speaking up, and remember abundance for all versus exploitation to advantage the few. Professor Tink Tinker (Osage) urged us to shake up our world view – the earth is our relative and we must build a respectful relationship with her, not exploit her.

About twenty-five Valley members participated in the Hennepin County plastic-free challenge in February! In May we will have another Sustainability group meeting. **Keep "showing up"!**

I clean it off by every Saturday though, because my husband and I play ping pong on Saturday nights (that started during the pandemic).
