

EARTH CARE CORNER

In May, Valley's sustainability group met to share a wealth of ideas and resources!

A few included:

- TARE Market (thetaremarket.com) where you can bring your own containers or borrow theirs to fill with products such as laundry soap, toothpaste bits, and shampoo. This helps avoid single use plastics. Their dishwasher soap works amazingly well!
- Co-ops such as the **Eastside Co-op** or **Wedge** where you can purchase items in bulk such as vegetables, fruit, maple syrup and hand soap in your own containers. This again reduces the use of plastic bags and containers.
- Tip: check out the plant-based restaurant Francis across the street from the Eastside Co-op.
- **Hennepin County resources** such as a guide to your refrigerator and how to dispose of unused medicines. County speakers at a senior's high-rise informed their group that plastic water bottles are indeed recycled in Minnesota but not in other areas of the country. Black plastic is never recycled so avoid it whenever possible.
- No matter where you shop, look for products that are packaged in paper or glass containers that can either be recycled or reused. It's also a good idea to purchase the largest size of container if the product only comes in plastic packaging.

The organizers of the Golden Valley PRIDE Festival are excited to gather with the community to celebrate their 5th Anniversary event! This is the first festival they've held since the Covid pandemic, so they are excited to return (as are festival participants, board members, vendors, sponsors and performers).

The 1st Golden Valley Pride Festival was held on June 12, 2016 at Brookview Park. It was the first suburban PRIDE Festival in the Twin Cities! The event was a huge success, with over 3,000 people in attendance. The 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Annual Golden Valley Pride Festivals were even bigger, attracting roughly 5,000 attendees each year.

What makes the festival so special is the family-friendly atmosphere. Kids can enjoy inflatable bouncy houses and obstacle courses, Giant Jenga and other yard games! NEW THIS YEAR: There will be 2 stages full of entertainment. General Mills is sponsoring a larger main stage at one end of the park, and there will be a smaller community stage at the other end of the park. Don't forget to register for the GLASS Volleyball Tournament and Stonewall Sports Kickball Exhibition Games!

There will be food trucks and many community vendors! There is sure to be something for everyone.
