Our Mission

We provide equitable housing and health care for persons with AIDS/HIV, particularly those experiencing long-term homelessness.

Who We Are

We are one of the locations of Clare Housing, opened in Robbinsdale in 2015. Clare Housing develops, owns, and manages properties and programs which support hundreds of people.

What We Do

Of the thousands of people with AIDS/HIV in Minnesota, half of them struggle with chronic homelessness, and many have very low incomes. Our programs reduce visits for emergency and hospital services, lower rates of risk-taking behaviors, and improve health outcomes.

Clare Terrace offers 36 units of affordable housing for people living with HIV/AIDs who experience poverty, homelessness, or both. Supportive housing ensures that residents are able to take their medication and work their way back to health. Staff and volunteers offer much-needed socialization and emotional support.

We believe people living with AIDS/HIV should have access to affordable, safe, and stable housing with the supportive services they need to lead dignified, satisfying lives.

Our Mission

We address weekend hunger by providing food for children who would otherwise be under-fed and under-nourished when school is closed.

Who We Are

We are congregations partnering with elementary schools in the Robbinsdale Area School District. At Valley, we are committed to KidPack at Noble Elementary.

What We Do

Hunger is a major barrier to learning, good health, and emotional well-being for hundreds of children right in our neighborhood. Many children depend on free or reduced breakfast and lunch at their school, but miss those meals on weekends. Sometimes, food competes with medicine or housing for very limited family dollars.

Any family may apply for this program, and none are turned away. At Noble Elementary, items such as cereal, one-serve meals, and granola bars go home with over 150 children every Friday. It's not enough for the whole family, but it helps feed young learners at Noble.

Food is purchased from The Food Group for \$2 a bag, and organized for distribution by church volunteers.

We provide social services and resources that empower people in our community to build healthy, stable lives.

Who We Are

We are a social service agency that helps local families during times of financial hardship.

In 1970, we were founded by Faith Partners in the Western suburbs. Many partners now collaborate with PRISM to serve those in need, right here in our neighborhoods.

We work with the community and for the community. Hennepin County and United Way recognized our success and integrity, and have chosen us as partners.

We obtain and deliver whole foods with maximum nutritional value. As the EBT and SNAP coordinator for the New Hope and Golden Valley Farmers' Markets, we enable families to improve their nutrition by using those assistance programs. We also accept the gifts of farmers at the markets, who often donate the produce that did not sell that day.

What We Do

We provide:

- Food for hundreds of families every month, and tens of thousands of individuals per year, from the PRISM Marketplace Food Shelf.
- School supplies to hundreds of students.
- The Holiday Shoppe, which gives the parents of more than 600 children two gifts per child.
- Children's programs that give back-toschool supplies, birthday gifts, and party kits to families.
- Shop For Change, our thrift shop, which supports PRISM's work.
- Job postings, mentors, and coaches to assist job seekers.
- Move-in kits that include bedding and cleaning supplies to families entering housing.
- Rental assistance, in cooperation with Hennepin County. We help households avoid eviction by providing financial assistance and connections to other support programs.

Our Mission

We provide immediate safety for battered women and their children, followed by assistance in their search for long-term safety, healing, and financial stability.

Who We Are

We are a program of Missions Inc., serving victims of domestic violence in the Northwest suburbs, including Golden Valley, New Hope, Plymouth, and many other cities in the area.

What We Do

Our 24-hour phone (763-559-4945) response connects women and their children with the Home Free Shelter, an immediate safe haven for up to 30 women and children.

Through counseling and education, we help victims understand and deal with the complexities of domestic violence. We also help them navigate the legal and criminal justice systems, prioritze their needs, set goals, and create a plan.

Residents gain access to social service agencies which provide financial support, transportation, medical care, and housing, along with education, activities, free childcare, and emotional support for their children.

We provide community education to bring awareness to domestic violence as a public health issue.

Our Mission

We improve lives by providing quality furniture and other essential items to families who are transitioning out of homelessness and poverty.

Who We Are

We are the largest furniture bank in North America, primarily operated by volunteers, and stocked with donations of furniture and household goods. We network with over 140 non-profits and social service agencies who verify their clients' needs before they refer clients to us.

What We Do

Since 1987 we have furnished over 75,000 homes. Volunteers help clients shop, transport furniture, sort housewares, repair electrical appliances, organize linens, and much more.

Our Project Good Night provides free treatment for pest infestation of bedding, thanks to donations, foundation grants, and below-cost fees from Adams Pest Control.

A dresser is a symbol of dignity for families who have been living out of boxes. In response, many volunteers purchase dresser kits and assemble them. Our goal is to provide one dresser for each of the more than 4,000 homes we furnish in one year.

Who We Are

We support families in crisis 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, through our free services.

Our services include:

- A 24-hour crisis hotline (763-591-0100).
- Crisis counseling for parents.
- Overnight residential child care for up to three days.
- The 4th Day Home Visiting Program, in which a Visitor works directly with vulnerable parents to facilitate long-term change and family stability.
- The Pediatric and Medical Management Program, which addesses the health needs of children.
- Parent education and support to families living in shelters through People Serving People (PSP).
- Onsite collaboration with school districts' Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) programs to help parents increase and strengthen their parenting skills.


The Mortgage Foreclosure Prevention program assists Minneapolis-area families facing foreclosure or who are behind in mortgage payments.


