September 10 - SUSTAINABILITY GROUP, Plant-Based Nutrition: Eating for Health, Spirituality, and Stewardship

Valley members Dawn Schuldt and Carolyn Anderson will explore ideas of wellness and present simple ways to incorporate plant-based eating. Along with a brief cooking demonstration, we will provide resources to stimulate curiosity in this transformative journey.

September 17 - WHERE CHRISTIAN VALUES AND NATIONAL INTERESTS COLLIDE - UKRAINE PALESTINE AND MORE, Rev. Bill Davnie

American Christians often see our foreign policy as an extension of our values of democracy, freedom, faith and more. But our values and our national interests – security, defeat of competitors and more – don't actually always coincide, and we quickly let our interests overwhelm our values. We'll look at how Christians here and elsewhere look at Ukraine, Palestine other aspects of our international presence.

September 24 - THAT'S NOT THE WAY WE'VE ALWAYS DONE IT, Sheila Sheldon

We are the reformed church, always reforming and that means things change from time to time. Sheila will share about the new things happening with education ministries and answer any questions you might have. Then she'll present Valley's new website and give a tour of where to find commonly searched content. Finally, two of our newest Parish Associates, Nancy Phillips and Rebecca Tollefson, will join us to share a little more about themselves, what they are doing now, and what they look forward to in the future.

October 1 - LOOKING INWARD, LOOKING OUTWARD, BEING A FRIEND, Rev. Nancy Phillips

October is Mental Health Awareness month. In this class we'll learn how diagnosed conditions such as anxiety and depression are on a continuum with the everyday sadness and worry that appear at times in everyone's lives. We'll also talk about friendship and walking with people through the difficult times. Nancy Phillips is an ordained clergyperson in the Reformed Church of America and worked for the church in the areas of ecumenism & women's issues. She is also a licensed clinical social worker and served as an individual/family therapist in the Fairview clinic system.

October 8 - LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT UPDATES, Crystal Boyd & Jim Rock

Crystal Boyd will share an update on the 2022 oral history project and new projects that have been inspired by this important work. Then, Jim Rock will share an update on the work happening in Mountain Lake, MN with Makoce Ikikcupi. Makoce Ikikcupi, meaning Land Recovery, is a project of reparative justice on Dakota homelands in Minisota Makoce (Minnesota).

October 15 - BREAD FOR THE WORLD

We have a great opportunity this fall because the US Farm Bill is up for reauthorization. Federal nutrition programs, a part of the Farm Bill, provide 10 times as much food assistance as private churches and charities combined. Bread for the World volunteers will show us how to speak up so the government will listen and help feed hungry children and families.

October 22 - PROGRAMMING SABBATH

We will take October 22 as our Sunday of Sabbath from programming.

Adult Ed classes will resume on October 29.

October 29 - WHITE NATIONALISM, Brandon Schorsch, Jewish Community Action

Brandon Schorsch from Jewish Community Action will return to Valley to lead us in a discussion of white nationalism. This concept has been with us since the Civil War and is seeing a current and dangerous resurgence. We need to be aware and learn how to name and disrupt it.

November 5 - RECALIBRATING OUR SPIRITUAL GPS, Rev. Anna Kendig Flores

Our Presbytery has voted to accept the recommendations of the Institutional Race & Equity Self-Assessment Team. Come to this session to learn about the five recommendations for seeing our way forward and building our antiracist assets as a Matthew 25 Congregation. The Presbytery's Anti-Racism Institutional Assessment Coordinator, Rev. Anna Kendig Flores will lead the discussion.

November 12 - MISSION SUNDAY

In the Valley we believe strongly in making a difference in our local community and beyond. We don't just talk the talk, we walk the walk with our friends and neighbors. Come hear the latest news from our local Mission Partners as they share about their work over the past year and how they are continuing to serve the community today. Learn how you can get involved with our mission partners and participate in family friendly Doing Good Together service activities.

November 19 - SUSTAINABILITY GROUP, Water Conservation

Carolyn Anderson will lead a discussion about how water conservation is more than just turning the water off to brush your teeth or changing the type of shower head you use. Learn how even the foods and products we choose impact our water system.

"We have lived our lives by the assumption that what was good for us would be good for the world. We have been wrong. We must change our lives so that it will be possible to live by the contrary assumption, that what is good for the world will be good for us. And that requires that we make the effort to know the world and learn what is good for it" (Wendell Berry, <u>The Long-Legged House</u>). How might we at Valley do that?

- Explore a plant based diet. New research from the University of Oxford states that people who follow a plant based diet account for 75% fewer greenhouse gas emissions than those who eat more than 3.5 oz of meat (ex: a quarter pounder) a day. Join adult education on September 10 for information on how to give it a try.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT TASK FORCE

This group meets virtually each month. In May, Susie Potter joined the team. Through a grant from the University of Wisconsin, we're working with a Native videographer to create a pronunciation video for Haha Wakpadaŋ, the Dakota name for Bassett Creek. The video received support from the City of Golden Valley's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Commission and the Bassett Creek Watershed Management Commission.

The Haha Wakpadaŋ / Bassett Creek Oral History Project is included in a forthcoming book about Indigenous oral histories as it is considered the first suburban American Indian oral history project in the United States and Canada.

VCPC has partnered with Hennepin History Museum (HHM) to increase awareness of the creek's Dakota name. In July, HHM hosted two events at VCPC: a kickoff for community partners and a Listen and Learn session with Roxanne Gould. In November, HHM will host its capstone celebration at VCPC. We're glad to support this community networking that was inspired by VCPC's oral history project.

Please mark **Sunday October 8** on your calendar as we will celebrate **Indigenous Peoples Sunday** with special music from Jim Rock. **Hope to see you there!**

In August, members of the task force participated in a hands-on work day with Makoce Ikikcupi at Hohwozu Otunwe (Village of Vibrant Growth). This new village features a traditional Dakota earth lodge and is located in Mountain Lake, MN.

$igg)_c$ Tell us about yourselves!

We are Hafi, partners in life, love, and crime (just kidding about the last part).

Hafi is me (Kristy!) and Luke, Minnesota transplants who are currently living in Amsterdam. I call a few places home, but spent many of my formative years in Wyoming, Minnesota.

I lived my whole life in Minneapolis/St. Paul — starting in Robbinsdale! (near 36th and Major Avenue, by the old Tom Thumb). I went to Bethel University for college and did a double major in English and Philosophy. I worked for a corporate IT startup; ran a kinda crazy literary magazine called Revolver; presided as president of House of Mercy, an artsy ELCA congregation in St. Paul; and now live in Amsterdam with Kristy and two monsters we call cats.

Q: What are your professional backgrounds?

a bit scattered! Early education, special education, copywriting and editing / marketing, yoga teacher / studio manager, sports massage therapist. When Luke and I moved to Amsterdam, I envisioned myself starting a Body / Movement Therapy practice (something between yoga, massage, and physio).

I started my career at a corporate IT startup — we sold SAP security services and products — where I worked with really big companies. Before the company was sold, I was made a (very small) partner. I decided to get out of the corporate world (kinda boring). I launched a literary magazine that gained some local acclaim (we won Best of MN one year! also where I met Ms. Hanson) and started doing freelance design and development work. We couldn't figure out how to make money with the magazine but I got busy with design/development. That's been my main gig ever since!

Q: Where did the idea for Hafi originate?

We'd always worked together in a very informal way. Luke had his business, I had mine, but every now and then Luke would need an extra hand. At the start of the pandemic, Luke got very busy and I was very... not busy. We decided to work together in a more formal way and merged our talents (and names). Hafi = Hanson and Finsaas

Why Hafi? First, we've got rent to pay. Second, good design shouldn't be reserved for big fancy companies with billions — we believe in making good, functional websites that don't cost organizations the equivalent of a small house. Third, fun! We get to work with a lot of different companies. Recently, we've launched sites for German protein researchers using AI, an electronic recycler in Virginia, a climate advocacy campaign asking big tech companies to leave the Chamber of Commerce, and Hippo Pockets, Centro's latest mini-concept.


Q: What is the goal of the work you are doing for Valley?
