Dear Friends,

Since this is my last Stewardship Letter with you, I want to start off by saying that I am filled with gratitude, both professionally and personally. In 2022, we started the year with a fair amount of concern, as we had lost some of our bigger pledges through death. By the end of the year, we discovered that some of these saints were in a position to leave a large amount to this congregation in their estate.

Fast forward to October 2023. One of our long-term members, Dr. Barbara Johnston, passed away this year. We have been notified that Valley will be receiving a large sum from her estate. For those of you who knew Barbara, she was passionate about Peace, Justice, Earth Care, and Mission.

Her funds are not intended for our general budget but are there to go above and beyond through causes that were her passion. The amounts are coming in smaller payments to Valley. Our first amount has already provided us with our dream of having solar panels on the new roof we installed this year!

What does this mean to our pledging? It means we can pledge generously to this year's budget knowing that we will not have any building projects that require extra giving. This year, we are turning Mariah Messer's position into a full-time role. We are so excited that she will now be responsible for leading our Senior High Youth ministry. Our session is asking for a 3% increase to provide our staff with salary increases in response to the increased cost of living that we are all experiencing. With this transition happening, staff will be hard at work filling in duties as they arise. And yes, I am so grateful for all our staff! Each week they put their best foot forward and this shows through with our vibrant worship, engaging programs, and attention to detail that makes Valley so inviting.

My planned retirement comes at a time when this church is financially, physically, and spiritually healthy. This puts Valley in an amazing position to attract a talented candidate to help move this congregation into the future on a firm foundation.

2024 will not be a year to take a break from our call to serve. Through the giving of time, talent, and treasures, Valley will nurture all the ties that bind this congregation together. God is surely at work in this place.

GIVING FROM THE HEART



Stewardship season gives us the opportunity to reflect on the past year, and to be grateful for all the ways Valley enriches our lives and those in our community. We are grateful for an amazing staff and for all of the volunteers who dedicate their time and talent to do God's work.

Over the past two years, we experienced the loss of several members of our congregation. These members gave of their time, talents, and treasures greatly over the years, and we are grateful for the time they spent with Valley. Some of these members left funds to Valley in their estates, which help to eliminate the need for a capital campaign to fund special projects. However, the majority of these funds do not contribute to the annual budget, so your pledge is still needed to ensure Valley can continue to serve the community and the congregation as it does today.

This year, the Valley Stewardship Committee and Session asks you to consider a pledge increase of 3%. This increase will help us 1) close the gap created by the members who are no longer with us; 2) increase budget for staff salaries due to the adjustment of Mariah's role and the need for more support during the upcoming transition; and 3) pay for a cost-of-living increase for our staff.
