A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

APRIL 2024

Dear Valley,

Christ is Risen! As we celebrate the risen Lord, I cannot help but think of Mark's account of the Resurrection. The women discover the open tomb with an angelic messenger inside who tells them to "tell his disciples and Peter that (Jesus) is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him" (Mark 16:7).

Every version of the Resurrection story is different, but Mark's account always reminds me to keep a keen eye on where I am and what is happening around me. If Christ goes ahead of the disciples, it seems that wherever they go, Christ will have been there and they will see evidence of that presence. Similarly for us today, when we become aware that Christ walks ahead of us and the Spirit guides our feet toward him, we too can be inheritors of that beauty. Wherever we go, we can see Christ's message of love and peace, calling us to unity. And we can play a part in that story by living out that same message.

It heartens me to see the hard work of our mission partners and the many ways we live out the message to love and care for all here in the Valley. As we enter April and celebrate our 5 year anniversary as an **Earth Care congregation**, we see how God has been at work.

The first steps we took pre-Covid have grown into an entire array of solar panels on our roof! It is a chance to remember that we are called to steward all of Creation, caring for plants, wildlife, and the whole of the environment that God has given us to oversee.

She has heard God's call to serve the Valley congregation in a greater capacity by preaching, working with the deacons, and administering the sacraments, and the service on the 14th will be an opportunity to not only celebrate that call but also surround her with our love as she takes this step in her vocation.

The Easter season pairs well with the renewal of Spring: it is a reminder that hope grows despite any tumult of the world. In a world that constantly seeks to divide us, let us come together and shout our Hallelujahs as one community who loves, supports, and cares for one another!

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE AN **Earth Care Congregation?**

Valley Community Presbyterian Church was recertified as an Earth Care Congregation by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)'s Presbyterian Hunger Program through February 2025. The Earth Care Congregation certification is designed to recognize churches that make the commitment to take seriously God's charge to "till and keep" the garden.*

This status speaks to the serious commitment that Valley has made to care for God's earth. To become an Earth Care Congregation, this congregation affirmed an Earth Care Pledge to integrate environmental practices and thinking into their worship, education, facilities, and outreach.*

Valley member Julie Westerlund said it best: "The certification requires a balance of effort in four main areas: worship, facilities, education, and outreach. We get points for various activities we do in each category. Valley rocks it in all four areas, but we need to keep adding new points each year to maintain our certification."

Started in 2010 by the PC(USA), the goal of this program is to inspire churches to care for God's earth in a holistic way, through integrating earth care into all aspects of their church life. The Earth Care Congregation certification honors churches that make that commitment and encourages others to follow their example.*

"Valley Community Presbyterian Church is just one of the 3,331 churches in our denomination that chose to dedicate themselves to intentional care of God's earth this year. This congregation's activities and commitment brings hope to their community and indeed to the world. We believe that Valley Community Presbyterian Church will inspire others to respond intentionally to God's call to care for the earth," says Jessica Maudlin, Associate for Sustainable Living and Earth Care Concerns for the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).*

We see the call to care for the earth every day at Valley through things like the Community Garden, recycling and compost bins, children's messages, and Sustainability Group meetings. But one of the most exciting aspects of this program is that there are ways for everyone to get involved. If you are passionate about something or would like to get more involved, talk to a Valley Elder or committee member to find out how!

Immigrant Task Force Update

Valley's sponsored family, the Karwans, continue to develop their independence in our community. Silab is now taking responsibility for most of their connections for finances, early childhood education, and services. Arlene Freeberg still helps them to navigate complex medical systems.

When their toddler Razaullah is about 2 1/2 years, he will have matured enough to be able to have a **procedure to close the defect in the upper chamber of his heart**. This permanent procedure is much simpler than open heart surgery, as a device similar to a button is inserted through a large vessel and becomes fixed in the wall between the 2 chambers. But first, Razaullah must gain more weight. The family is so grateful for the expert medical care here in Minnesota.

The Karwans are moving! They have signed a lease on a home in Minneapolis that they will be renting. The family is very excited to be in a house of their own. Silab continues to work hard at achieving a specific **goal of buying a house** as soon as it is feasible. They understand the factors involved in building a good credit rating. We will encourage them to take a course in home ownership that is offered by the Afghan Cultural Center. Living in their rental home will no doubt be good practice as they continue to work toward homeownership. We are also launching them in their independence for all responsibilities of the upkeep and insurance of their car this spring.

Mina and Silab Karwan and their three children are now in the midst of observing the month of **Ramadan**. We send them good wishes for the **celebration of Eid Al-Fitr on April 9**.

Barbara Johnston left Valley a generous gift from her estate that has been used to preserve Valley's work of living out our faith for years to come. Some of those dollars are being used to maintain the building to prepare it for another 75 years of service to our community and world. Work will be done this summer on the Sanctuary and Cornerstone Room: removing asbestos tile before it becomes a health risk, maintaining the wood ceilings, and refreshing carpeting.

Work will begin on June 3rd, and we will worship in Fellowship Hall while the work is carried out. We are eager to see what God has in store for this congregation in the coming decades, and we are excited that our beloved Mission Station will be ready to provide support to the community for years to come!
