

## A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

**MAY 2024** 

Dear Valley,

Spring is in full swing here in Minnesota: trees are budding, flowers are blooming, and birdsongs are returning to our ears. In this season of rebirth and renewal of nature, we also remember the renewal that we have through Christ. Not only have we received the promise of eternal life through the Cross and

Resurrection, but we have also been called to be the community that offers hope and renewal to all people.

It always amazes me to see how Valley rises to that call day-in and day-out. We care about our members through programs like the **Y.E.S. Tea** that took place on April 27th for the benefit of our young people seeking post-secondary educational opportunities. And we cannot forget as well the continued efforts of our dedicated board of deacons who reach out to and care for individual members of our church community. But our care for God's beloved community does not stop at the doors of our church. Our **Pack the Pews** campaign in March totaled 1,840 pounds of food for our community partner PRISM. That equates to over 25% of their total donations from all area churches and countless mouths that will be fed with your generosity.

Just as our generosity never ceases, needs never cease as well. I encourage you to find a way that you can support our church in its mission to open hearts, minds, and lives to God by caring for all. **Meals on Wheels** is in a deep need for drivers if you are available on Thursday mornings, our community **Blood Drive** will take place on May 14th in which we can give tangible support to our own church members who rely on blood transfusions. Finally, I hope you will share Valley's welcoming heart with a community that has historically been hurt by organized religion during the **Golden Valley Pride Festival** on June 8th.

As we look forward to the rest of spring and summer, I also hope you will engage with our community through one of the many opportunities available to you. # Update on the Pastoral Transition

A major step in the transition process is completing a **Ministry and Mission Study** (MMS). # Congratulations, Valley!

In honor of our <u>Hahá Wakpádan / Bassett Creek Oral History</u>

<u>Project</u>, we've been awarded the **2024 Minnesota History Award**for **Museum Collections** from the Minnesota Alliance of Local History

Museums (MALHM)!

In April, Crystal Boyd traveled to Duluth to **present about the project** at the annual MALHM conference. She accepted the award on Valley's behalf alongside our partner, John Crippen, the executive director of Hennepin History Museum. To help inspire similar work across the region, Crystal also presented about the oral history project to the **Presbyterian Synod of Lakes and Prairies**.

In May, <u>Makoce Ikikcupi</u> will close on a wild rice property on pristine Turtle Lake in Itasca County. Makoce Ikikcupi is a Dakota land recovery project that Valley has supported through our connections

with Jim Rock and Roxanne Gould. Now, the Twin Cities Repair Community has set a fundraising goal of \$60,000 by May 31 to help Makoce Ikikcupi build an earth lodge and offer programming at this new site. 

Valley has always been an open community that I feel a part of and I always looked forward to pastoral counseling on the golf course with Richard every summer.


## $igotimes_{:}$ Do you have one Valley memory that stands out to you?


