

Land Acknowledgement Task Force

Thank you, everyone! The Land Acknowledgement Task Force is grateful for a wonderful summer with Valley. Now we're looking forward to an exciting fall!

In April, the Twin Cities Repair Group launched a **campaign** to help <u>Makoce Ikikcupi</u> close on a wild rice property in Itasca County. Makoce Ikikcupi is a Dakota land recovery project that Valley has supported through connections with Jim Rock and Roxanne Gould. And great news! We surpassed the goal and raised a whopping \$66,490! The property includes 40 acres of land with 170 feet of shoreline on Turtle Lake. The new site has been named **Pratkasada Otunwe (Painted Turtle Village)**. We helped make Land Back happen!

In June, Hennepin History Museum worked with Anishinaabe photographer Ne-Dah-Ness Greene to take **portrait photographs** of participants in the <u>Hahá</u> <u>Wakpádan / Bassett Creek Oral History Project</u>. We're exploring ways to exhibit the portraits across the Twin Cities!

Also in June, Margie Deutsch helped Crystal Boyd with **history research** at the Minnesota Genealogical Society. We're learning more about Joel Bean Bassett, the namesake of Bassett Creek, and his family.

In July, Valley partnered with the North Loop Neighborhood Association and Hennepin History Museum to host a **clean-up day** at James I. Rice Park. This is where Hahá Wakpádan meets the Mississippi River. Thank you to Janet Triplett and her granddaughter for pulling lots of invasive species! The event received some nice coverage from <u>KARE 11</u>.

And the oral history project just keeps growing! We were also lucky to receive some great media coverage this summer from Minnesota Public Radio, MinnPost, Sun Post, and CCX Media.

This fall, the Land Acknowledgement Task Force continues to collaborate with Anishinaabe artist Summer Sky Cohen on a **land acknowledgement banner**. This beautiful textile will feature floral designs and be installed later in Valley's entryway downstairs.

WHAT ARE THE TOP SOLUTIONS WE AS CONSUMERS CAN TAKE TODAY?

- Cut food waste; 30-40% of food is wasted by consumers and food supply chains.
- Eat less red meat and dairy products. Cows, sheep and goats are ruminant animals, producing large amounts of methane.
- Track what you throw away; what could you do differently?
- Try ingredient-based meal planning use what you have.
- Help maintain stewardship of forested lands.
- Remember that the earth is the Lord's, and we are the caretakers.






