A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

NOVEMBER 2024

Dear Valley Family,

If you are anything like me, you may find yourself constantly asking yourself, "how is it only 5:00 right now and pitch-black outside?" As the days shorten and the air gets colder, it becomes clear that winter is on the way. Plants have turned brown going into hibernation, and birds have by and large flown south for the winter. That is, all except for a few holdouts like the cardinal.

While at a conference in November, some colleagues and I went for a walk through the woods and were talking about the state of the world when a cardinal suddenly fluttered past us and landed on a nearby branch. My colleagues and I stopped for a minute and admired how his bright red plumage stood out against the dull brown background and it got me thinking back to a message I recently preached about those exact birds.

In that message, I wondered how we as a church stand out against the backdrop of the world. How does our love for ourselves and one another serve as a beacon for everyone we encounter?

As we move into Advent and await the coming of the Christ child, we remember how God chose to be Emmanuel – God With Us. God has walked in our footsteps. God has loved, God has wept, God has suffered, and God has comforted. And God has called us to that same task. As we





Wow! What a great month! Valley and its many community partners enjoyed a busy October with many big events:

- On **Indigenous Peoples' Sunday**, the congregation enjoyed special music from Jim Rock (Dakota) and a breathtaking banner reveal with Summer Sky Cohen (Anishinaabe) during the worship service. Please check out the banner in its new location downstairs in the entranceway. This beautiful textile celebrates Valley's commitment to working with Indigenous partners and recognizing the area as an Indigenous landscape.
- On October 14, Valley co-sponsored the Second Annual Hahá Wakpádaŋ Water Blessing. More than 120 people attended and opened their hearts and minds to heartfelt words from award-winning author Diane Wilson (Dakota), water protector Roxanne Gould (Anishinaabe), cultural advisor Bradley Blackhawk (Ho-Chunk), and many others. - On October 19, a group of runners and walkers from Valley enjoyed the Hahá Wakpádaŋ Loopet Loppet. This vibrant day featured Indigenous games, movies, literature, food, and a vendor market. By supporting this event, Valley is helping to improve the visibility of Indigenous communities in spaces where they've often been overlooked.

For **Thanksgiving**, read up on Indigenous history and consider incorporating Indigenous foods like wild rice and maple syrup. Steven Peters, <u>a Wampanoag Tribe spokesman</u>, shares his views about how many Americans gather for a traditional turkey meal:

"My ancestors had 4 harvest festivals throughout the year. Gathering with family, enjoying our company, sharing our blessings, and giving thanks for all that we have is a good thing. I say have more thanksgiving events throughout the year. I also ask that you take a moment in that day to remember what happened to my people and the history as it was recorded and not the narrative that we had been given in the history books."
