Clare Housing

This project is a 36-unit supportive housing development for people living with HIV/AIDS. The building includes studio apartments plus community space.





The project is being developed by Clare Housing, a local non-profit with a successful track record of developing permanent supportive housing and providing services for persons living with HIV/AIDS. At least seven of the units will serve persons experiencing long-term homelessness.
