from 1998-2004 and Acting Principal Clarinet during the 2003-2004 season. She has been a member of the Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra of Minneapolis since 2002 and was the winner of the 2003 and 2005 Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra Concerto Competitions.

As a freelancer, she has performed with several orchestras, including the Ohio Chamber Orchestra, the Cleveland Pops Orchestra, the Akron Symphony Orchestra, the Duluth Superior Symphony Orchestra, and the Minnesota Orchestra.
