A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

NOVEMBER 2025

Dear Valley,

November is a patchwork quilt of a month, made up of multiple seasons that hold deep, important meaning. It begins with Stewardship for the first two weeks, moves into Thanksgiving in the middle of the month, and wraps up with our call to the annual observance of Advent. At times it feels like spiritual whiplash, like you don't know how to feel. Generous? Thankful? Hopeful? Why not all three?

As disparate as these seasonal moods may seem, I seem to be feeling all of these moods at once as I think about my time at Valley, and perhaps some of you feel that as well. As most of you know by now from emails that were sent out earlier this month, I will be stepping down from my role at Valley at the end of the year to make way for new things God is doing in all of our midst. The PNC is concluding their work discerning Valley's next pastor, and I have heard the call to the next chapter in my spiritual journey as I continue to guide both individuals and communities through seasons of change.

AN UPDATE FROM PASTORAL NOMINATING COMMITTEE

The PNC is excited to announce that we have narrowed down the pool of pastoral candidates to two finalists and have conducted in-person interviews with both of them. The next steps are a meeting with the Committee on Ministry (COM) and Presbytery, scheduled to happen in late November. As we finalize our discernment, and if the Presbytery concurs with the call, Session will call a full congregational meeting where the congregation will hear a sermon by the nominee and conduct a vote during the congregational meeting. We will provide updates to the congregation as we continue through the process and learn more details. Please continue to pray for the PNC, the candidates, and for Valley as we continue to get closer to choosing our next Head Pastor.





Land Acknowledgement Task Force

Wow! What a great month! Valley and its community partners enjoyed a busy October with many big events:

- On **Indigenous Peoples' Sunday**, the congregation enjoyed special music from Jim Rock (Dakota). He also led a memorable Children's Sermon about the bison and Bible stories.
- On October 13, Valley co-sponsored the **Third Annual ḥahá Wakpádan Water Blessing**. More than 130 people attended and opened their hearts and minds to heartfelt words from Indigenous youth with the Native nonprofit Dream of Wild Health, cultural advisor Jim Rock (Dakota), water protector Roxanne Gould (Anishinaabe), and many others. Check out the media coverage from the [Sun Post](#) and [WCCO](#).
- On October 18, The Loppet hosted its second **ḥahá Wakpádan Loopet Loppet**. This vibrant day featured race events, hiking, and Indigenous food and a vendor market. It also hosted the photography exhibit "[Native Voices: Stories from ḥahá Wakpádan](#)," which is open until November 30. By supporting the event, Valley is helping to improve the visibility of Indigenous communities in spaces where they've often been overlooked.
- On November 11, **Mission Possible** added a line item of \$300 to its budget for the Indigenous Justice Task Force to utilize in 2026. This is the first step towards incorporating a steady, long-term commitment to Native communities into Valley's budget.

For **Thanksgiving**, read up on Indigenous history and consider incorporating Indigenous foods like wild rice and maple syrup. Steven Peters, [a Wampanoag Tribe spokesman](#), shares his views about how many Americans gather for a traditional turkey meal:

"My ancestors had 4 harvest festivals throughout the year. Gathering with family, enjoying our company, sharing our blessings, and giving thanks for all that we have is a good thing. I say have more thanksgiving events throughout the year. I also ask that you take a moment in that day to remember what happened to my people and the history as it was recorded and not the narrative that we had been given in the history books."




