After several years in New York, Hanne and Kyle moved to Boston so Hanne could attend law school while Kyle completed his M.Div. from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary. After their first daughter, Elsie, was born, they decided to move to Minnesota to be closer to family (and the State Fair). They now have three children: Elsie (6) loves playing with friends, Arik (4) loves animals (especially giraffes), and Ingrid (1) just learned to walk(!). Kyle enjoys music, reading, coffee, and having









his hopes raised and dashed by his favorite Minnesota sports teams.

Since graduating from seminary, Kyle has served in various ministry settings in New Jersey, Louisiana, and Minnesota, in roles ranging from Director of Worship to Lead Pastor. Through these experiences he's discovered a passion for helping build strong and deep relationships within the church and surrounding community.

Kyle sees the church as God's beloved community: "It's the community in which we're beloved by God, cherished by one another, and invited to share God's love with the world around us." For Kyle, this means the church is a place of welcome and belonging, a community that seeks justice and works for the flourishing of all people, and lives into the hope and joy that God is renewing all things. What excites him most about pastoral ministry is walking with people in their faith journey, helping people encounter God's beauty and mystery, and watching a community grow deeper together in our identity as God's beloved.




