A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

ADVENT 2025

Dear Valley,

Often in Advent you will hear pastors talk about it being "the season of expectant hope." I tend to use that kind of language as well because it cuts to the core of what Advent stands for: waiting for what God has promised to us. We are reminded of that promise when we hear the words of Isaiah to open the season: "For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders, and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace" (9:6). To those

who heard his words millennia ago, they were filled with hope of a reunified nation and a promised home, but what does that mean to us, today?

When I first took on this role nearly two years ago, I can now say that no one fully knew what to expect. I didn't know anyone, nor did anyone know me. STEWARDSHIP 2026

LAST CALL FOR GIVING COMMITMENTS: DECEMBER 21, 2025

The Valley Session is in the process of finalizing the 2026 budget, and approximately 85% of Valley's 2026 budget income is derived from stewardship giving. As a result, the stewardship goal for the current campaign has been set at just over \$406,000. To date, we have received giving commitments totaling roughly 82% of this goal!

INTRODUCING PASTORAL CANDIDATE KYLE SANDISON

Kyle Sandison grew up in Grand Rapids, Michigan, attended Calvin University, then moved east to work at New City Kids, an after-school center in Jersey City, New Jersey. He then served at City Grace Church, a church plant in lower Manhattan, where he met his wife, Hanne.

After several years in New York, Hanne and Kyle moved to Boston so Hanne could attend law school while Kyle completed his M.Div. from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary. After their first daughter, Elsie, was born, they decided to move to Minnesota to be closer to family (and the State Fair). They now have three children: Elsie (6) loves playing with friends, Arik (4) loves animals (especially giraffes), and Ingrid (1) just learned to walk (!). Kyle enjoys music, reading, coffee, and having his hopes raised and dashed by his favorite Minnesota sports teams.









Since graduating from seminary, Kyle has served in various ministry settings in New Jersey, Louisiana, and Minnesota, in roles ranging from Director of Worship to Lead Pastor. Through these experiences he's discovered a passion for helping build strong and deep relationships within the church and surrounding community.

Kyle sees the church as God's beloved community: "It's the community in which we're beloved by God, cherished by one another, and invited to share God's love with the world around us." For Kyle, this means the church is a place of welcome and belonging, a community that seeks justice and works for the flourishing of all people, and lives into the hope and joy that God is renewing all things. What excites him most about pastoral ministry is walking with people in their faith journey, helping people encounter God's beauty and mystery, and watching a community grow deeper together in our identity as God's beloved.

Kyle and his family are thrilled about the opportunity to call Valley their home church, and they look forward to meeting everyone and getting to be a part of the community.




